

With an electric hoist and changing table as well as a toilet and wash-basin, the Mobiloo means that even those wheelchair-users with the most complex requirements can get out and about to enjoy the same opportunities as everyone else.

2017 SWDFEF at Newport County AFC

I know that we have only just had our 2016 SWDFEF, however, we are pleased to announce that Newport Gwent Dragons RFC attended at Bristol City. As LPF have already included Rugby Union Premiership clubs in their efforts, which are focused on removing the social model of disability barriers in all sports, there was a positive response at Bristol City, when it was mentioned that, perhaps we should invite other Rugby clubs in our region to the next SWDFEF. Therefore, Bristol Rugby, Cardiff Blues RFC, Exeter Chiefs RFC, Gloucester RFC, Newport Gwent Dragons RFC and Ospreys Rugby Club will all be invited to the 2017 SWDFEF Forum.

Yeovil Town DSA

John Fry (Yeovil Chairman) held a meeting with the club's supporter sections, the Green & White Supporters Club, the Disabled Supporters Association, the Junior Glovers, Bridport Glovers and the Cary Glovers, on Tuesday 20 September, where the main agenda focused around the potential re-creation of a Supporter Alliance Group which would be named the 'Achieve By Unity' Fans Partnership. The Glovers Trust had also been invited, but declined the offer due to the implication that the meetings were for 'affiliated' supporters groups, with the Trust wishing to preserve their independence.

Between 2004 and 2010, the football club had held a series of meetings with a number of supporters groups and club directors and senior staff to discuss issues relating to the club, and in an attempt to improve the running of the club from the supporters point of view. The format went under numerous revamps and changes, with it being known as the Customer Charter Meeting, Achieve By Unity Fans Partnership and the Supporters Liaison Group, but the group meetings appeared to fizzle out around the end of the 2009-10 season and were not restarted until now.

Meetings will be held at least twice a year with agenda items being added through the 'affiliated' supporter groups, allowing for topics and concerns of supporters to be raised.

Swindon Town DSG

We had a fan who came down from Northampton, for their match against Swindon, on Tuesday 27 September and he had to have two Carers as he was on permanent oxygen. One of the Carers said that we were the most accommodating club they had been to and the only club that didn't charge for the extra Carer. They said that everyone from the person who did the booking of the tickets to the stewards in the car park and stadium had been wonderful. A very nice thing to be told and made me proud of my club. I passed this compliment onto our management. So hopefully we are winning, regarding getting our clubs to realise the importance of making life easier for Disabled fans, so that they can enjoy the environment they are seated in, even if we can't do anything about what is actually happening on the pitch as far as the play is concerned.
