





The ways in which you can help the Trust and the Club

THE Newport County AFC Supporters' Trust is one of more than 140 Supporters' Trusts that exist under the national umbrella of Supporters' Direct.

The Trust was originally formed in 2001, and took a controlling stake in the football club in October 2015 following a community share issue which saw County supporters raise a magnificent £236,000 in just a month. Since then, Newport County AFC has been a supporter-owned club.

The Supporters' Trust Board currently consists of nine elected and two co-opted directors.

As the Trust is the majority shareholder in the club, all 11 Trust directors are also registered with the EFL as directors of the club, having passed the EFL's Owners and Directors' Test. Your Trust/Club elected directors are: Kelly Anderson, Gavin Foxall, Shaun Johnson, Mike Everett, Ryan Courtney, Colin Faulkner, Bob Herrin, Paul Marks and Kevin Ward. The co-opted directors are Mark Crook and Peter Madigan.

There are a variety of ways in which County supporters can help the Trust. The more money raised by

the Trust, the bigger the budget available for the manager every season.

BECOME A MEMBER: A new tiered system of Trust membership has been introduced. This is explained in more detail in the table on the next page.

Bronze: £5 a month; Silver: £10 a month; Gold: £20 a month; Platinum: £50+ a month. There is also a membership package for Ex-Pat supporters at £25 a month. Corporate membership is available at £1,000 a year or £600 for six months.

EASYFUNDRAISING: Join easyfundraising and you can collect free donations for theTrust (and therefore the Club) every time you buy something online.

It won't cost you a penny extra. Just start your online shopping first at www.easyfundraising.org. uk/causes/ncafctrust/, then shop as normal.

Retailers will then make a small donation to say 'thank you'.

There are more than 3,200 retailers to choose from and so far this scheme has raised almost $\pounds 18,500$ for the Trust.

Emotional tributes to Justin Edinburgh

FORMER Newport County AFC manager Justin Edinburgh - the man who took the club back into the Football League - was posthumously inducted into the club's Hall of Fame in an emotional ceremony during the club's home match against Leyton Orient.

Justin passed away suddenly and tragically at the age of 49 last summer, shortly after gaining promotion to the Football League with Orient - just as he did with County in 2013.

Since then, Justin's family has set up the JE3 Foundation.

The charity aims to raise awareness of heart disease, campaign for 'Justin's Law' – which will make it mandatory for all gyms throughout the country to have defibrillators – and provide funding for such equipment at key venues.

The match against Orient raised funds for the Foundation.

At half-time, Justin's widow, Kerri, daughter Cyndie and son Charlie attended the induction. The presentation was made by four members of Justin's promotion-winning team of 2013 - captain David Pipe, midfielders Lee Minshull and Max Porter, and striker Aaron O'Connor.



Sticker packs are available to purchase for £1 from the Kingsway Club Shop, Bar Amber, and the pop-up shop on match days in the marquee at Rodney Parade.

Meanwhile, County's match against League Two leaders Swindon Town on Saturday, January 18, is the next designated Clwb Spytty game. Clwb Spytty is the junior branch of the Supporters' Trust, developing the next generation of County fans.

Youngsters who are Clwb Spytty members can attend four matches



a season free of charge, accompanied by an adult who will pay just £10 for their ticket.

Tickets for the Swindon match are on sale now at the club shop in the Kingsway Centre. There will be plenty of fun

activities for children before Sat-

urday's game from 1.30pm. And Clwb Spytty members can collect their free gift in the marquee before the match.

Clwb Spytty membership costs £15 a season.

Members receive a welcome pack including a letter from Spytty, membership card and Clwb Spytty passport; free gifts and activities at designated games; a quarterly newsletter from Spytty.

They can vote for the Clwb Spytty Player of the Year; benefit from exclusive opportunities as part of the matchday experience; attend a free Christmas party; and receive birthday & Christmas cards from Spytty.

Walk for dementia on April 5

NEWPORT County AFC are teaming up again with Newport Live and Alzheimer's Society Cymru to host the city's second sponsored walk for dementia.

Last year's inaugural event saw 350 members of the public joined by the former Mayor Cllr Malcolm Linton, Mayor, MPs, AMs, city councillors, and Newport County AFC players, management and directors to raise vital funds for people living with dementia in the city.

This year's walk will take place on Sunday, April 5, starting at 11am from The Riverfront Theatre & Arts Centre.

The gentle 3km walk is open to all ages and abilities and will raise vital funds for Alzheimer's Society Cymru.

All money raised by the Newport Walk for Dementia will be used for local dementia services. Last year's event raised in excess of £6,500.

A JustGiving event has been set up to ensure money raised from the walk is used in the Newport area. Fundraisers can use the link to set up their own individual JustGiving page for the event by visiting bit.ly/NewportWalkFor-Dementia.

Money raised through Facebook directly is not guaranteed to be ring-fenced for local use, so organisers are encouraging walkers to only use approved fund-raising tools such as the JustGiving event.

Newport County AFC's Director of Equality & Diversity, Colin Faulkner, said: "We're excited to have teamed up with our partners to make this event happen again. The money raised last year makes a real difference to people."

The group, which has been set up by David Watkins, aims to offer veterans easy access to any support they may need, as well as offering a space to socialise.
